### **Uniform Reminders**

Many pupils take the opportunity in this term to wear the 'summer uniform', although this is not compulsory. Children in years 1 to 7 may wear grey shorts, a white polo shirt and the yellow jumper; or the yellow summer dress and white cardigan. There has been some debate over white trainers — these are permitted if they are *plain white*, but the traditional school shoes are adequate and we are not encouraging anyone to go to the expense of purchasing white trainers just for school.

We continue to take pride in appearance and a tidy uniform. We maintain the highest of standards with school uniform, because this in turn reflects positively on children's attitude and behaviour. Do not be surprised if your child is wearing incorrect uniform and a member of staff gently reminds them of the appropriate uniform. No jewellery beyond a plain stud ear-ring should be worn by any pupil.

## **School Development Planning**

Kilmaine staff are continually reflecting on best practice, leading school improvement programmes and developing the curriculum to improve outcomes for all the children that attend the school. Look out this term for the 'Parent Survey', where senior leaders, teachers and curriculum coordinators will be asking for your feedback. We plan to use this information to inform our future planning and strategic direction as we commence a new three-year cycle of school development planning in September 2024.

#### School Finances

I have spoken before about the dire financial circumstances all schools, including ours, are faced with. More than ever, I wish to highlight and personally thank the vital work of the PTA at Kilmaine. We have relied on this financial support to subsidise school trips, purchase educational resources such as iPads and reading books, and generally to enrich the opportunities we can offer the pupils who attend. If possible, please give generously to the PTA's fundraising efforts.

#### Homework

If you have not already, I encourage you to read the school's Homework Policy, available on the website. Homework is a vital part of learning and yet the staff at Kilmaine do realise there is a fine balance between allowing the children opportunities to be proud of and experience success with their home learning and activities, whilst still having the opportunity for all the extra-curricular activities which children of this generation are often engaged with.

In an age appropriate manner, we encourage you to support your children with ALL aspects of homework: reading, learning and written homework, spellings and maths information. Homework is still issued and viewed as really important in term three and it often sets the precedent and groundwork for your child's transition into the next school year.

#### Health and Safety at our School

I politely remind you that dogs are not allowed on school grounds, under any circumstances, without prior permission from myself and the Board of Governors. If your child is at the stage of walking home from school or leaving school grounds to meet a car a little further away, please constantly remind your children of road safety and the high expectations of behaviour and attitude that are required of all pupils at all times. With the lighter evenings drawing in, I do see lots of Kilmaine children socialising around our local area. Teachers will be reminding pupils of 'stranger danger', road safety, anti-social behaviour and their responsibilities as young, moral citizens, so thank you for reinforcing these messages at home.

Thank you for your support in all of the above. My door is always open or catch me in the mornings at drop-off or at home time for a quick hello, or to speak more specifically about any of the matters raised.
